### CRIMINAL COMPLAINT

Bruce A. Daniels, Chief Deputy, Taylor County Sheriff's Department, being first duly sworn on oath, states on information and belief.

That on or about January 2, 1999, in the Town of Medford, Taylor County, Wisconsin, the defendant did intentionally take and carry away moveable property of another without the owner's consent, and with intent to deprive the owner permanently of possession of such property, contrary to Wis. Stat. §943.20(1)(a).

PENALTY: Class A Misdemeanor, punishable by a fine not to exceed \$10,000, imprisonment for not more than 9 months, or both;

And prays that said defendant be dealt with according to law, that the basis for the complainant's charge of such offense is:

This complaint is based upon the investigation of the Complainant and the Taylor County Sheriff's Department. Complainant serves as Chief Deputy for the Taylor County Sheriff's Department. His information is based upon his personal knowledge, and the records and files of the Taylor County Sheriff's Department. Complainant has relied upon those records and files in the past and have found them to be both true and reliable. Those records and files indicate the following:

That on or about January 2, 1999, the defendant was questioned by law enforcement officers. At that time, the defendant had in his possession a firearm. The defendant told Taylor County Sheriff Department Juvenile Officer Harlan Schwartz that he knew the gun belonged to Terry Thomas, and that he knew his brother Eddy was holding onto the gun for Terry.

That Terry Thomas contacted the Taylor County Sheriff's Department and reported that his weapon was missing. Juvenile Officer Schwartz contacted Paul Peterson at his residence. Paul stated that Terry Thomas had been target practicing at his residence with a gun and that he had put it in a drawer in the house and left it there. Paul stated that the gun is missing and that he does not know where it went. Paul described the gun as a small caliber .22 or .32.

Edward Peterson stated that in mid-December 1998, Terry Thomas was at a party at his house and left his pistol there with him. Edward Peterson stated that he gave the weapon to his father, Paul. Edward Peterson stated that later on, he noticed that the gun was gone. Edward Peterson stated that when his brother, the defendant, returned from a trip, he had told Edward that the police had searched the van and found Terry's gun.

Complainant believes the statements of Terry Thomas, Paul Peterson and Edward Peterson to be both true and reliable since they are based upon the personal knowledge, information and belief of said citizen witness.

Complainant believes the statements of the defendant which incriminate him to be both true and reliable since they are made against his penal interests.

From all of this, Complainant believes this complaint to be both true and correct.

#### NARRATIVE:

On 01-02-99 at approximately 2:52 a.m., Rock Co. Dispatch advised me to meet a Boone County Deputy on E Stateline Rd. and Northrup Rd.. Dispatch advised that the Boone County Deputy was out with a vehicle at that location and that they had three young subjects in the vehicle and they had stated they were looking for a residence on Tighe Rd.. Boone County advised that the subjects were not sure of the residence location and they felt the situation was a bit suspicious.

I went to the location on Stateline Rd. and met with Boone County Deputies Molloy and Mordt. Deputy Mordt advised that he was on his way home and came across this van parked on the roadway at this location. He stopped to see what was going on and was advised by the driver and registered owner of the van that they were looking for a residence on Tighe Rd.. Deputy Mordt stated that he wanted assistance in identifying the subjects and was concerned about the female subject in the vehicle as she was only 15 years of age, and they were all from the Medford area. He stated that there was also some luggage containing clothes, makeup, etc, and was concerned that the female might be a runaway.

The subjects who were identified as Robert Peterson, Dale schwartz and Jerilyn Rakovec were all seated in Deputy Molloys squad upon my arrival. Deputy Mordt advised that Peterson had stated that his parents were at this residence that they were trying to locate, stating that it was his aunts house and they

were getting together for the holidays. Deputy Mordt also advised that Peterson had given them permission to search the van.

Deputy Miester, Boone Deputies Mordt and Molloy searched the van and I talked with Peterson. Peterson stated that Jerilyn was his girlfriend, and that her mother knew that she was with him and that they were coming down to this area. Peterson gave me Jerilyn's mothers phone number and I had dispatch call the number and speak with Jerilyns mother. She advised dispatch that she did know where Jerilyn was and that she had her permission to be with Peterson. She advised dispatch that they were boyfriend/ girlfriend and that they were good kids that had met at Bible school. She did appreciate us checking and asked if there was any problems.

During the consent search of the van, Deputy Molloy found a magazine for what appeared to be a 22 pistol in the console of the vehicle. The magazine had three rounds in it. I asked Peterson why the magazine was in the vehicle and he stated that he did not know. He stated that his Uncle, Terry Thomas uses the van periodically, and stated that he does own a 22 pistol, but did not believe that that was in the vehicle at this time. The officers continued there search and Deputy Miester did find a Jennings "J-22" model semi auto pistol wrapped in a towel and inside the door frame of the rear sliding passenger door. The pistol was a small silver handgun with a black handle. There was not a magazine in it, nor was there a round in the chamber. The pistol had a serial # 669784. I had dispatch run a check on it, and it came back wih no hits.

The Boone County Deputies stated they would handle the situation if we wanted them too, but advised as stated earlier that he was going off duty, and it didnt matter to him if we wanted to take care of it. I advised him that we could take it, as they would have had to transport the subject to their jail, etc. until bond could be posted.

Peterson identified this pistol as looking like the one owned by his uncle. Peterson stated that his uncle lived in Medford also, on CTH E, but did not know his phone number. I advised Peterson that I was going to be giving him a Municipal Ord. Citation for carrying a concealed weapon. I also advised him that the pistol would be placed into evidence at the Rock County Sheriffs Dept. and be kept until the matter was settled. I also gave Peterson a property receipt for the weapon and advised him that his Uncle could come to the Sheriffs Dept. and pick up the weapon once the matter was disposed of.

A QPP check was run on Peterson with negative results. Peterson did tell me that he had a Juvenile record for thefts and an auto theft, but advised that he has been staying out of trouble. I issued Peterson the citation for the concealed weapons charge, with an initial court date of 02-01-99 in Janesville Intake Court.

Both Schwartz and Jerilyn denied having any knowledge of the weapon being in the car.

I asked Peterson if he had any idea what the address was that they had been looking for was, and he stated that he did not. He advise that he did have a telephone number, which he gave to me, and I had dispatch call the residence. Dispatch advised that they did make contact with subjects at that phone number and stated that they were relatives of Peterson. They advised there address was on Summerville Rd., just north off of STH 67.
